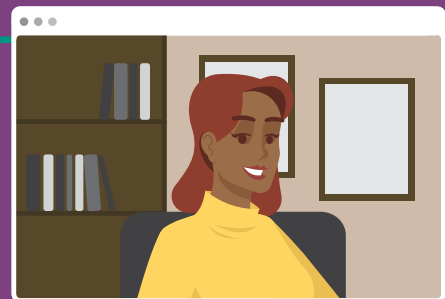


Getting the Interview
